Globally, many technological innovations are taking place. A regular reading of the newspapers and browsing the websites of IEEE and sites dealing with technology reporting will be very useful to most of our readers who are the students, the architects of the future India. Few items of interest include:

The single-seater, solar-powered Solar Impulse aircraft which runs on four electric propellers powered by 12,000 solar cells mounted on the plane's 63-meter wingspan landed smoothly in the dark at Dulles International Airport near Washington DC.

It is predicted that by 2030, India's water supply deficit will be 50% and will eventually make India as a "water stressed" region. Information Technology will play a major role in solving this problem. What IT brought to banking in the 1990s, it is now poised to bring a similar though less visible revolution to utilities around the world, be it water, energy, gas, waste management or public transportation. It has been reported that an Intelligent Operations for Water (IOW) solution, has resulted in a saving of 3,409 gallons of water per year per household in the City of Dubuque and in Miami-Dade County, it has resulted in a saving of \$8,60,000 per year from pro-active management of resources.

Faculty Development Programme on "Embedded System and its Applications to Power Systems, Power Electronics"



The IEEE Madras Section in association with IEEE SB of Arunai College of Engineering, Thiruvannamalai organized a Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on "Embedded System and its Applications to Power Systems, Power Electronics" on 31st May and 1st June 2013. This was the 24th FDP in a series of programs aimed at improving the quality of teaching in Engineering Colleges in Tamil Nadu.

This FDP was attended by 41 faculty members of colleges and universities from all over Tamil Nadu. The coordinators of the program were Dr. N. Sharmila, Professor of EEE, CEG, Anna University, Chennai; Dr. T. S. Sivakumaran, Dean (PG Studies), Arunai College of Engineering.

The topics covered include: Embedded applications in power electronics -- Introduction to embedded systems, Need for embedded systems, Designing of microcontroller based embedded system for motor control, Designing of FPGA based embedded system for motor control, A hybrid concept for real-time embedded systems controlling power electronics applications, Hybrid electric vehicle applications and electric traction. Embedded applications in power systems -- Designing of embedded system controllers for electric systems, Power control, Power inverters, Embedded operating systems for real time applications, Dynamic power management in an embedded system.

At the valedictory, Mr. R. Selvaraj, Secretary, Aruani College of Engineering distributed the Certificates to the participants. The FDP received an excellent feedback from all the participants and provided an opportunity to listen to the experts.

Call for Proposals for 2013 R10 Section, Subsection and Chapter Support Fund

IEEE R10 Section, Subsection and Chapter Committee invites you to submit proposals to bid for 2013 Section, Subsection and Chapter support fund for section of chapter leadership and social activities.

Objectives:

- Promote more activities in sections and chapters with financial support from region.
- Strengthen the operation of sections and chapters operations and activities.
- Provide more activities for the community in order to make IEEE more visible.
- Ensure the quality of operation and leadership ability sections and chapters.

Project Categories

- 1. Leadership Seminar/Training/Workshop: Sections and chapters may invite distinguished resource persons to give seminar, training or workshop that will enhance the leadership and management abilities of its members.
- 2. Family Day: Members of different sections and chapters are encouraged to meet for social gatherings. They may also include their spouses, children and family members in order to extend the IEEE community in the home of its members.
- 3. Sports Competition: Sections and chapters members may organize a special event for sports activities like basketball competition, fun run, bowling competition, badminton tournament, etc.
- 4. Community Involvement Activity: Sections and chapters may organize an activity for community involvement such as tutorials for children, field trips in underdeveloped communities, research application for underdeveloped communities, and help directly the calamity stricken areas.

Proposal Condition

R10 Section, Subsection and Chapter Committee will provide support fund to carry out the activity in partnership with respective sections, subsections and chapters which aims to promote and strengthen them through leadership and social activities for its members and the community.

- The R10 fund (SSBR) is targeted at activities from September. 2013 to Dec. 2013.
- The proposal forms must be completed by proposer and endorsed by the Section Chair.
- In the proposal form, the proposer information, the proposal information, the budget plan and the requested budget (\$300 to \$700) should be specified. The proposal should be also duly endorsed by the Section Chair. (Signature of the Chair)
- R10 Section, Subsection and Chapter Committee provide part of the cost of the activity (\$300 to \$700) in each case. Part of the cost of the activity must be borne by the respective section or any other sources.
- Proposal must be submitted to the IEEE R10 Section, Subsection and Chapter Committee Chair no later than the end of June in electronic means. Please make sure that an acknowledgement is received after sending the proposal within 7 working days, or it should be assumed that the submission is not received.
- After the end of program, proposer has to submit the result report according to the general guideline for the R10 Newsletter and the final financial report for the activity. The report should be sent within 2 weeks after the activity.

- The result report would be published in the R10 Newsletter.
- After confirming the result report and the financial report, R10 Section, Subsection and Chapter Committee will start the fund transfer process.
